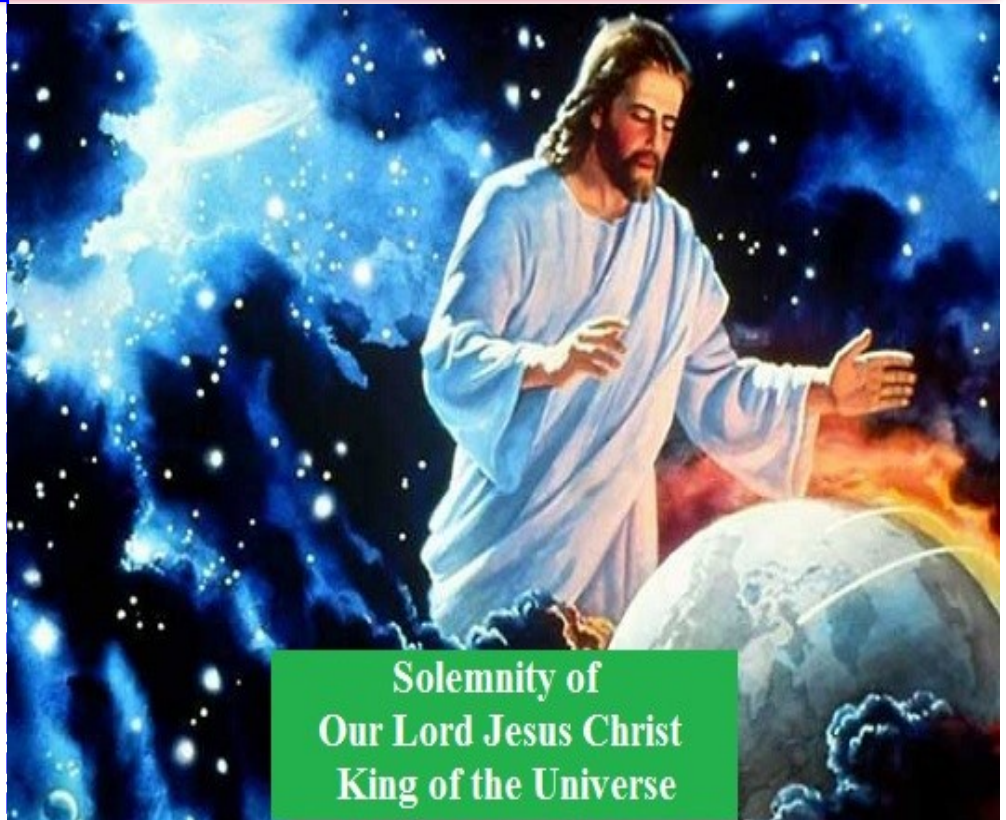

Fulfilling a promise to her mother (Rose Ramelli) in 2007, Donna Dye carries on her mother's mission of making rosaries for foreign missions. Rose made rosaries for approximately 20 years. Donna purchases the beads and other materials, hand makes the rosaries, and mails out 200 rosaries per shipment to various foreign missions; most recently to the Dominican Republic and regularly to the Rosary Project of Africa. Africa was Donna's mother's favorite country to support. The Rosary Project for Africa was born out of a pilgrimage to Fatima in 2008 where missionaries distribute rosaries free of charge to people within 9 countries within Africa so far, e.g. Nigeria, Cameroon, Uganda, Tanzania, and Kahama. As a result, there have been a dramatic increase in converts to Catholicism and formation of rosary prayer groups. Also in 2003 after Rev Msgr Boahen Kyereme's visit to St. Peter Church, Donna sent him over 600 rosaries to Ghana, West Africa. Missionaries' goal is to enable a million voices reciting the rosary every day as the rosary is our mightiest weapon, and with it, the Sacred Heart of Mary will triumph.

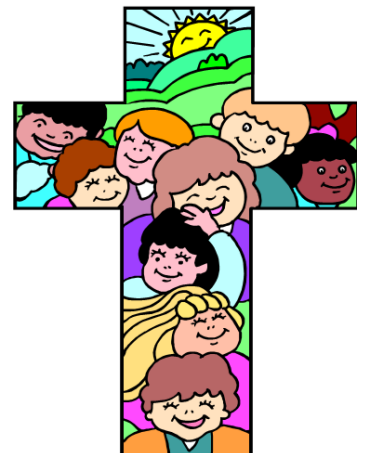
