#### Congratulations, Deacon Jack, on the 33rd Anniversary of your Ordination and 55 years of marriage!!

Born and raised in Philadelphia, Jack and Alice were High School sweethearts (although they went to different schools), and were married on May 30th, 1964. They have 3 children, 5 grandchildren and 1 1/2 great grandchildren (the latest one due to arrive in September).

Jack ,(a Vietnam Veteran), served in the Marine Corps (after graduating from High School) from 1962 to 1966.

They have been in South Florida since 1976. Jack was ordained a Permanent Deacon at St. Vincent DePaul Seminary in Boynton Beach, and served at St. Thomas Moore Parish in Boynton Beach, Emmanuel Parish in Delray Beach and St. Rita Parish in Wellington, Florida. They moved to the Keys 15 years ago, and Deacon Jack first served at San Pablo Church in Marathon, and about 10 years ago, came to St. Peter's.

He used to have his Captain's license and ran boat tours for the KOA Campground, and also worked at Sea Camp. He had a Private Pilot's license, and whenever not flying or boating, he and Alice used to explore Florida by motorcycle.....so actually, you may call him: Reverend Mister Captain Deacon Jack Pierce......

Deacon Jack is a wonderful homilist who serves actively in our parish liturgies and he and his wife Alice, help with Marriage, Baptism, and RCIA preparations. Deacon Jack is also an ex-officio member of our Parish Pastoral Council. Fr. Jets feels that we are very blessed to have Deacon Jack and Alice in our parish family.
