St. Monica, whose feast day is August 27, was St. Augustine's mother. She was born in 331AD in Tagaste which is in present-day Algeria. When she was very young, she was married off to the Roman pagan Patricius, who shared his mother's violent temper. They had 3 children: Augustine, Navigius and Perpetua. After the conversion of her husband and her mother-in-law, Perpetua and Navigius entered the religious life, but Augustine resisted, and after many years of prayer, St. Ambrose helped St. Monica, and together they managed the conversion of Augustine. St. Monica often brought, to the chapels of the martyrs, offerings of food for the poor. When she died in 387, she was buried at Ostia. In 1439 Pope Martin IV ordered her relics to be brought to Rome and many miracles were reported to have occurred along the way.

Saint Augustine, son of St. Monica, whose feast day is August 28, was raised Christian, but spent his early years in loose living and worldly ambitions. After his conversion, (for which his mother prayed for 17 years) he began a new life. He became a priest, a bishop and a famous Catholic writer. His most famous work was his Confessions, an autobiographical work consisting of 13 volumes written between 397 and 400 AD, and outlines his sinful youth and his conversion to Christianity. He overcame strong heresies, practiced great poverty, supported the poor, preached often and prayed with great fervor right up until his death





John the Baptist

The Memorial of the Passion of St. John the Baptist is August 29th. The Memorial began in the 4th century AD at the dedication of the Church of St. John at Sebaste in Samaria, Israel, where, according to tradition, John's skull had been buried by his disciples. It was formerly known as The Beheading of St. John the Baptist. John the Baptist's suffering and death prefigures Jesus' suffering and death, and the details in the account of the Passion of John anticipate the Passion of Jesus. John spoke the truth, Jesus is truth; it was the festive occasion of a birthday, it was the festive occasion of Passover; Herodius bitterly opposed John, the religious leaders bitterly opposed Jesus; John was arrested and bound, Jesus was arrested and bound; Herod declared John innocent, Pilate declared Jesus innocent. Roman soldiers put John to death by beheading, Roman soldiers put Jesus to death by crucifixion; John's disciples took his body and laid it in a tomb, and Joseph of Aramathea took the body of Jesus and laid it in a tomb.
