

In addition to Cardinal John Henry Newman, Pope Francis canonized 4 women saints on Oct. 13



St. Marguerite Bays: was born in Switzerland in 1815, the second of 7 children. She grew up in a farming family and at 15, apprenticed as a seamstress, a skill she practiced all her life. She prayed the rosary regularly, attended daily Mass, visited the Blessed Sacrament. She spent all her free time working in the parish—taught catechism to the children, visited the sick, took care of the poor. This led her to join the Franciscan Third Order now known as the Secular Franciscan Order in 1860. She felt her way to holiness lay in daily service to her family.

In 1853, when she was 35, she was operated on for intestinal cancer. The treatments were very invasive and she prayed to Our Lady for healing and for a different understanding of suffering. She developed the stigmata, the crucifixion wounds of Jesus, on her hands, feet and chest. On Fridays and during Holy Week, she would fall ill or experience moments of ecstasy. Gradually the pain became worse and on June 27, 1879 she died.

St. Mariam Thresia Mankidyan: was born in 1876 in Kerala, India, and named after St. Teresa of Avila. She spent her entire life assisting the poor, the sick, the elderly and all those in need. Her mother was the greatest influence in her childhood, reading her stories from the Bible and teaching her how to pray. When she was 20, she made a private vow of virginity and decided to consecrate her life to Christ. She also tended to the sick, the poor, nursing lepers and caring for orphaned children. She had a series of mystical experiences, including the gift of healing and prophesy. She bore the stigmata in secret and passed through her own "dark night of the soul". At first, she joined the Franciscan Poor Clares, then the Discalsed Carmelites of Ollur. In 1913 she created her first small community with two friends. It was to become the Congregation of the Holy Family. During the 12 years she was the head of the Congregation, it flourished with new convents, schools, boarding schools and orphanages. She died on June 8, 1926.





St. Guiseppina Vannini: her childhood name was Guiditta, and she was born in Rome in 1859. Both her parents died within 3 years of one another, and Guiditta and her 2 siblings were left orphans. It was at the orphanage run by the Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent DePaul that she first experienced the call to religious life. At a spiritual retreat she met Fr. Luigi Tezza who asked her to assist him with restoring the Camillian Tertiaries. She took the religious name of Sr. Gieseppina and soon became Superior General of the new Congregation known as the Daughters of St. Camillus which received official approval in 1909. She died in 1911 from heart disease in Rome at the age of 51. By then, the Camillians already had 156 professed religious and 16 religious houses between Europe and America. Her main legacy she left her Sisters was the pure and simple physical and spiritual care of the sick, exercised at home, in hospitals, leprosariums and nursing homes.

St. Dulce Lopes Pontes: was born in Brazil in 1914. Her secular name was Maria Rita. After her mother died, she went to live with her aunts. When she was 13, they took her to visit one of the poorest areas of the city. She was so struck by what she saw that she began dedicating herself to the poor and needy of her neighborhood. She was particularly devoted to St. Therese of the Child Jesus and felt a strong calling to religious life. She was ready to perform the "small acts of love" that Jesus transforms into great works. After entering the Congregation of the Missionary Sisters of the Immaculate Conception of the Mother of God, she became Sr. Dulce, her mothers name and spent her time caring for the local poor. She founded the Sao Francisco's Workers Union and opened a clinic, a library, a school and even a cinema for the poor. She developed serious respiratory problems and had to spend 16 months in the hospital. Pope John Paul II Came to visit her when he was on a trip to Brazil in 1990. She had been nominated for the 1988 No-



bel Peace Prize in recognition of her work and was known as the "Mother Teresa of Brazil". She died March 13,1992.
