



In memoriam:

Father Randall Musselman's life as a priest ended where his life as a Catholic began, at All Saints Church in Sunrise.

A father and grandfather who was ordained at 58, Father Musselman died Feb. 21, after a brief battle with cancer and other complications. He was 69 and had been pastor of All Saints — his home parish — since July 2018. The funeral Mass was Tuesday, Feb. 25, at 10:30 a.m., at All Saints, 10900 West Oakland Park Blvd., Sunrise.

Archbishop Thomas Wenski, was the main celebrant of the funeral Mass. "He loved his ministry, and he loved being pastor at All Saints where he had previously served as a permanent deacon," the archbishop added. "He will be buried from the parish church he attended with his wife and family and later returned to as pastor."

Father Musselman, born May 19, 1950 in Anderson, Indiana, was raised in the Baptist church. He felt the call to ministry early on and even entered a Baptist seminary in his home state. "But definitely the Baptist church didn't work for me." He married Teresa Garcia in 1976 and they raised their two daughters in the Catholic faith. He converted to Catholicism in 1987. That's when he felt the call to ministry once more.

He was ordained a deacon in December 1994 and served All Saints in that capacity for 13 years. His wife died in 2007, and he entered St. Vincent de Paul Seminary in Boynton Beach. On May 9, 2009, he was one of three new priests — two of them grandfathers —ordained for the Archdiocese of Miami.

He served as parochial vicar at <u>St. Elizabeth Ann Seton</u>, Coral Springs, from July 2017 to the end of June 2018; administrator and pastor of <u>St. Peter Parish</u> in Big Pine Key from July 2014 to June 2017; and parochial vicar at <u>St. David Church</u>, Davie, from June 2009 to July 2011, when he was named parochial vicar at <u>Nativity</u>, in Hollywood. He also served as a deacon at <u>St. John XXIII</u> in Miramar while studying for the priesthood, from 2007 to 2009.

Father Musselman is survived by his daughters, Karina and Kelly, and three grandchildren: Brandon, Brenda and Jaxson. He was buried at <u>Our Lady of Mercy Cemetery</u>, Doral, immediately following the funeral Mass.
