

<u>Building Committee:</u> The new entry and exit to the property is complete. Traffic now enters to the right of the Food Bank and exits from the left of the Food Bank. This will stay this way until the new entry ramp is completed in early October. Almost 350 cubic yards of concrete were poured Thursday. All of our footings for the church and hall are now complete. See the parish website and this bulletin for new photos. Can concrete block and fill be far behind? Stay tuned!

Food Bank Ministry: Our stocks are at an all time low, partly because of increased "competition" from other organizations for commodities that normally come to us. Several new organizations are serving meals and giving out food in the BPK area. Also, Feeding South Florida, our main source of foodstuffs, is now doing mass distribution themselves. Last week they were in Marathon, this week in BPK. We all share a common goal, and that is to get food to those who need it. No one knows how long these other entities will continue, but we here at St. Peter will keep our doors open as long as we have food to distribute. A Mother's Day Prayer

TUESDAY. MAY 5. 2020

"Since prayer is a universal value, I welcome the proposal of the Higher Committee for Human Fraternity that believers of all religions should unite spiritually on 14 of May for a day of prayer and fasting and works of charity, to implore God to help humanity overcome the coronavirus pandemic.


Remember: on May 14, all believers together, believers of different traditions, to pray, fast, and perform works of charity." Pope Francis

The proposal for this worldwide day of prayer came originally from the High Committee for Human Fraternity, which was established in September 2019 as a concrete response to the <u>Document on Human Fraternity for World Peace and Living Together</u> signed by Pope Francis and Sheikh Ahmed el-Tayeb, Grand Imam of Al-Azhar, during the <u>pope's visit to the United Arab Emirates in February 2019</u>. As the pope endorsed that call today he explained that "since prayer is a universal value, I accepted its proposal [for this day of prayer]."

It calls on "all peoples around the world to do good deeds, observe fast, pray, and make devout supplications to God Almighty to end this pandemic." It continues that "each one from wherever they are and according to the teachings of their religion, faith, or sect, should implore God to lift this pandemic off us and the entire world, to rescue us all from this adversity, to inspire scientists to find a cure that can turn back this disease, and to save the whole world from the health, economic, and human repercussions of this serious pandemic."

The committee "invites all religious leaders and peoples around the world to respond to this call for humanity and together beseech God Almighty to safeguard the entire world, to help us overcome this pandemic, to restore security, stability, healthiness, and prosperity, so that, after this pandemic is over, our world will become a better place for humanity and fraternity than ever before."

The committee is composed of nine members, including Cardinal Miguel Ángel Ayuso Guixot, president of the Pontifical Council for Interreligious Dialogue, Mohamed Hussein Mahrasawi, president of Al-Azhar University, Monsignor Yoannis Lahzi Gaid, personal secretary of Pope Francis, and Judge Mohamed Mahmoud Abdel Salam, advisor to the Grand Imam. It seeks to promote that Document on Human Fraternity, which reminds people everywhere that we are all brothers and sisters and members of the



one human family, a point that is reinforced by today's call to prayer and fasting.

The appeal was published in English, Italian, French, German, Spanish, Arabic, Afghan, Malaysian, Persian, Swahili, Turkish, Urdu, Chinese and Jewish.



Congratulations Fr. Jets on the 10th Anniversary of your Ordination!

Fr. Jets was looking forward to celebrating his 55th Birthday (AARP eligible now!), his 10th Anniversary and his Installation as official Pastor of St. Peter Church (he's been officially called our "Parochial Administrator"— but we all know he has been our amazing pastor and loving shepherd all along) on April 19th, when, as we all know, the coronavirus changed everything.

During the quarantine he has been busy meeting virtually with the contractor and architect about our building project, consulting with the Legacy Committee about items to be offered as memorial donations in our new church, and writing his all-parish emails.

Fr. Jets was born and raised in the Philippines by his parents, Pat and Connie and is one of 5 siblings. He earned his Bachelor of Science degree and license in Engineering (ECE) from the Royal Pontifical University of Santo Tomas in Manila. He later trained and earned his U.S.FAA licenses in Flight Engineering and Aviation. He flew as an Airline Pilot for Philippine Airlines for almost 10 years.

Fr. Jets came to the U.S. following his parents' immigration, to continue his career in aviation, but the tragic events of 9/11 limited the opportunities, so while waiting, he volunteered at his parents church—St. Martha in Miami Shores. Through the inspiration and guidance of his pastor, he discovered his vocation to the priesthood and entered the minor seminary at St. John Vianney in Miami for the Pre-Theology course. He continued his priestly studies and graduated from the major seminary at St. Vincent DePaul Seminary in Boynton Beach where he eared his Masters of Divinity *cum laude*. He also attended the Institute of Priestly Formation at Creighton University in Omaha where he earned masters credits in Christian Spirituality. He was ordained to the priesthood of Jesus Christ by Archbishop John Clement Favalora on May 8, 2010—the first Filipino to be ordained in the Archdiocese.

Since his ordination, Fr. Jets has served as Parochial Vicar in the parishes of Our Lady of the Lakes in Miami Lakes, Holy Rosary-St. Richard in Cutler and Palmetto Bay, St. John Neumann Church in Miami, and as Chaplain at Archbishop Coleman Carroll High in West Kendall where he also taught Theology courses.

He was assigned here 7 weeks before Hurricane Irma in 2017, and as you know, is in the midst of his first major building project. He is also the Director of the Office of Ministry to Cultural Groups of the Archdiocese. He is also a loving and doting uncle to his four nephews. We feel so blessed to have him at the helm as we navigate the choppy waters of the building project and the Coronavirus together, and hope he stays with us until he retires! Happy 10th Anniversary Fr. Jets!

May we listen to Jesus' words and act on them so that we will be like the wise man who built his house on rock and pray the psalm..


