

## The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

NOVEMBER 22, 2020

On the last Sunday of the liturgial year, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Christ the King. The feast was instituted by Pope Pius XI with the encyclical *Quas primas*. The Holy Father speaks directly to the problem of "anticlericalism," which seeks to extirpate Christian influence from political life. We see a version of anti-clericalism today, for example, when it is suggested that belief in Catholic teachings renders a person unfit for a judicial appointment.

When our nation is beset by civic unrest, racial tension, and a pandemic, we do well to turn to Our Lord, who reigns over every people and nation.

## Jesus is the Word of God made flesh, the Incarnate Lord.

"The foundation of this power and dignity of Our Lord is rightly indicated by Cyril of Alexandria. 'Christ,' he says, 'has dominion over all creatures, a dominion not seized by violence nor usurped, but his by essence and by nature.' His kingship is founded upon the ineffable hypostatic union. From this it follows not only that Christ is to be adored by angels and men, but that to him as man angels and men are subject, and must recognize his empire; by reason of the hypostatic union Christ has power over all creatures." -Quas primas, 13






The Feast of Christ the King is this Sunday, November 22




