

An update on your Food Bank Activity:

Normally summer is a slow time for us, but we are maintaining our winter number of clients. We continue to help 60-70 people each week. We find our needs now include personal care items—-laundry detergent, shampoo, hand soap, body wash, bug spray, etc. The Dollar Stores are a great resource for these items affordable and in smaller sizes. Other needed items are canned goods e.g. tuna & chicken, Vienna sausage, hearty soups, canned meats—Chef Boyardee products, (flip top cans appreciated), canned vegetables, boxed milk, and fruit. *St. Peter Catholic Church is a 501(c)(3) corporation.*

Help us to bear witness to the dignity of all whom you have created, regardless of stage of life, or wealth,


or ability,

We look forward to our first Children's Mass of the year, next Sunday, October 30 at 11am


