# March for Life shifts focus to Capitol Hill on the 50th Anniversary.

# We welcome Fr. Paul Milanowski to St. Peter Parish again!!

Fr. Paul is filling in for Fr. Jets who is on a Sabbatical for priests in Rome for 4 months. Fr. Paul was the 3rd of 6 children born to Marguerite and Wencel of Grand Rapids, Michigan. His father was a lawyer, his mother a legal secretary and a convert to Catholicism.

He was in the Seminary starting in 9th grade, then in St. Joseph minor seminary for 2 years studying Philosophy in Cincinnati , and 4 years studying Theology at St. John's Major Seminary in Plymouth, Michigan. While in the Seminary, he enjoyed being a Chaplin at Boy Scout Camp in the summer.

He was ordained on June 5, 1965 and was assigned to parishes around western Michigan. He took a leave of absence from 1985 to 1992 to work in an inner city parish in London—St. Mary of the Angels in Bayswater. Father Michael Hollings, Pastor of St. Mary's, had an open door ministry where he offered sandwiches, tea and help to "the men and women of the road" —similar to Dorothy Day's Catholic Worker Houses.

Fr. Paul loves swimming, sailing, skiing (water and snow). He loves reading and keeping up with theology and Biblical studies.

He inherited a love of music from his mother who used to take them to concerts—he especially loves classical music.

Fr. Paul has joined his brother Mike in coming to the Keys for 7 years now.

Fr. Paul's brother Mike Milanowski: 5th of 6 children. Attended St. Andrew's Cathedral High School and graduated with a degree in Theater from Hope College in Holland, Michigan. After college he took care of his ailing father for 5 or 6 years, and after that, took care of his mother for another 20 years. As a result of his Theater training, he became friends with Burt Tillstrum, of "Kukla, Fran & Ollie" fame, and worked with him as a puppeteer for a time. While he was taking care of his mother, he got a degree in Culinary Arts at Grand Rapids Community College. Mike has been coming to the Keys for 30 years now—first with his mother, and then by himself until Fr. Paul retired—-and now they come together in the winter.
